She was believed to have worn this cloth/garment during the Annunciation of Jesus' birth and/or his actual birth.


Sanctuary Song

With thanksgiving I'll be a living sanctuary for You.



Saint James Disciple and Martyr South Porch 1194-1230














Diagram from Gordon Strachan, Chartres: Sacred Geometry,
